

## Hodgetts Timeline 3: Handsworth

Staff. <b>John Hogettes, chaplain</b>, sued John Scott, of Barre, husbandman, and Sibil, his wife, William Scot, of Barre, husbandman, and John Hurst, of Alrewych [4m north east of Walsall), husbandman, the younger, for insulting, beating, and ill treating him at Barre and taking from him 40s. of his money. The defendants did not appear, and the Sheriff was ordered to arrest and produce them on the Morrow of St. Martin, m . 247, dorso."<sup>i</sup></p> <p>This could be Great Barre near Walsall or (Perry) Barre. The ancient parish of Handsworth was divided into Barre (north of the river) and Handsworth (south of the river). Chaplains worked privately so he could have been:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. chaplain to the Wyrley family "the Episcopal Registers of Lichfield indicate that in the fourteenth century the Wyrleys were allowed a private chapel in their family home. The Kalendar for January 1360 records that the bishop had granted to Roger de Wyrley a licence to celebrate Mass in his overtories or household chapels at Honnesworth and at Tybinton (Tipton) for a term of two years." HHS] and then at the bishop's pleasure<sup>ii</sup></li> <li>2. chaplain to the Guild of St John the Baptist which owned Handsworth land (and probably a chantry).</li> </ol>

Between John Harpur, and Alianora his wife, complainants, and <b>John Hogettes, Chaplain</b>, deforciant of twelve acres of land, in Ruyshale, which Richard Colee, and Agnes his wife, held for the life of Agnes. John Hogettes granted the reversion of the land, after the decease of Agnes, to John Harpur and Alianora, and their issue, and failing such issue, to remain to the right heirs of John Harpur, and for this grant John and Alianora gave 20 marks of silver."<sup>iii</sup></p> <p><b>i.e. John Hogettes, chaplain sold Rushall land to John &amp; Elianor Harpur</b></p> <p>Note: Sir John Harpur of Rushall (1395-1464). His wife was Elianor Grober (dau/heir of William Grober (an ironmonger?) of Rushall) Lot of detail on him in 1917 SRS in file. <sup>iv</sup> and Willmore<sup>v</sup> John Harpur married Elianor Grobbere abt 1427 (her father William Grobbere fought at Shrewsbury under the Earl of Warwick. John Harpur was steward to the earl of Stafford and an MP for almost 20 years.<sup>vi</sup> [As Rushall had a population of only 150 people and the Hodgetts name was rare, John's ownership of Rushall land confirms a relationship to William Hodgetts of Rushall.]</p>

1435-37	[Context]		[Calendar of Close Rolls Henry VI] "During this period Staffordshire compared with other counties was peaceful. The sheriffs of these counties were ordered to prevent any man to go armed in fairs, markets or elsewhere in the presence of the justices or king's ministers. Our county was excepted possibly because it was loyally Lancastrian." <sup>viii</sup>

John the Chaplain seems to be married to Agnes. Although the church banned chaplains from marrying <a href="#">they could if they paid a fine</a></li> <li>3. Thomas Harpur of Dorlaston was a descendant of Sir John Harpur.</li> <li>4. In 1440, John Harpur rebuilt Rushall Church on the chapel site next to his manor house. (<a href="#">Wikipedia 16/7/2022</a>) Possibly <a href="#">this one: 1443</a> "John Harpur and Eleanor his wife to grant a messuage and land in Rushall to the perpetual chaplain of the chapel of St. Michael there, retaining land in Rushall. An Anna Harpur, dau of William Harpur of Rushall (<a href="#">Stirnet suggests possibly a natural dau</a>), married John Wyrley (alive in 1467 and 1508) son of Cornelius de Wirley of Handsworth (alive 1459) and wife Elizabeth Barton (alive 1428). "There seems to be little information of Sir William de Bermingham X or Bermingham men fighting in the 'Wars of the Roses' (1453-1471), but it would have been impossible for them to stay out of the fighting entirely. Evidence seems to support the idea that Sir William was on the Lancastrian side, though whether he did see any combat is unknown. Neither do we know if he or his son Sir William XI fought at the Battle of Bosworth in 1485 that brought the House of Tudor to the throne of England." <sup>xiv</sup>

It did not go back to the church but instead was awarded to Mary's supporters. John Lyttleton of Franckley, esquire was granted the keepership of Dudley Castle, the park and its lands.

Maud Scotte</a>, Thomas Scotte and his wife Agnes: rejoinder. 1562] “The defendant Mawde says that Richard Hodgettes her first husband was seised of a cottage and land in Handsworth, which he settled upon himself his wife Mawde, and their heirs, After his death the said Mawde was seised of the premises, and about a year since she enfeoffed William Scotte and Thomas Bromyche of the same, to her use for life with remainder to Thomas Scot and Agnes his wife and the heirs of the body of Agnes. For further surety she levied a fine this Easter term. Henry Wylleys never had any interest in the said premises. The complainant’s father and mother occupied the premises at the will of Henry Scott and the said Mawde his wife, at a yearly rent of 5s. <i>The replication of Henry Hodgetts</i>. The complainant denies the statements made in the answer.”</p>

Your orators pray that a write of subpoena may be directed to the said William James, Henry Wyllys, William Wyllys and Roger Cartwright.</p> <p><i>Answer of William James, Henry Wyllys, William Wyllys and Roger Cartwright.</i> The defendants say that about 21 years before a conveyance of all the premises was made to Richard Hodges son of the plaintiff Mawde, and to Margaret Wylles daughter to Henry Wylles on their marriage, and to the heirs of their two bodies and the deeds concerning the premises were delivered to them. If the said Mawde had any claim to the premises it was forfeited by her own confession made in her answer to a bill of complaint exhibited by Henry Hodges an infant son and heir of the said Richard and Margaret. The said Richard is now deceased and Margaret has married Roger Cartwright one of the defendants. The defendants say that they have not taken possession of any of the deeds concerning the premises. <i>Replication of Mawde Scott, Thomas Scott and Agnes his wife.</i> The plaintiffs deny the statements made in the answer. <i>Rejoinder of the defendants.</i> They deny that any deeds have come into their hands. <sup>xxiv</sup></p>
